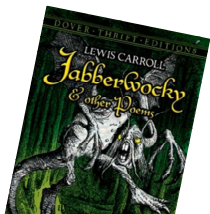
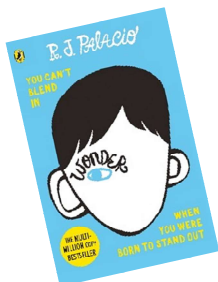

Key Learning this term...

In literacy this term, we will be exploring our work around the brilliant book 'Wonder' by R.J. Palacio. We are going to focus upon spoken language in literacy and provide the children with an opportunity to present to other members of the class. In our poetry unit we are going to understand and define the features used in the 'Jabberwocky' by Lewis Carroll and we hope to create our own version of this poem. During the term, we will be continuing to provide the children with mathematical investigations to enable them to develop their explanation and reasoning skills. In RE we will be focusing upon the term 'commitment', the children have already started by thinking about what they are committed to. We will be supporting the children with their transition this term and our PSHE work will provide them with an opportunity to talk about this openly.
