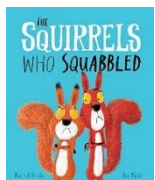


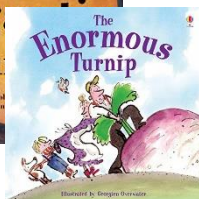


Newsletter Y1 and Y2 Autumn Term 2022

Our class texts...



This term, Y1s and Y2s are learning all about ourselves, friendship and teamwork.



Key Learning this term...

Welcome back to class 1. This term Y1s and Y2s are learning all about 'Ourselves'.

In science we will name parts of the body, learn about getting older and investigate our senses!

We are very excited to be using our new maths scheme - Power Maths! We will learn about place value, reading and ordering numbers and addition and subtraction.

In literacy, we will read 'The Enormous Turnip' (a tale about teamwork) and write our own version of the story. We will read and write instructions linked to our topic about childhood games and poetry linked to our topic - 'Our Senses'.

In art/d+t, we will explore 'hinges' and 'pivots' as we make a moving replica of ourselves. We will also study the work of artist Picasso and make a self-portrait, using drawing and collage techniques.

In RE lessons, we will consider how it feels to 'belong' and find out 'how' and 'why' special celebrations e.g. baptisms and weddings are celebrated.
