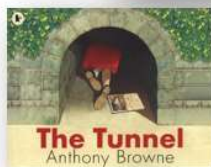

Key Learning this term...

This term our topic is 'Explorers!'

Year 1s will be using Little Wandle to ensure our children can read fluently and with prosody and understanding. This term we will revisit phase 5 sounds. Your child will continue to receive their new Little Wandle decodable or fluency reading book and their chosen reading for pleasure book every Friday. Please encourage your child to read at home with you, 3X per week. Year 2s will learn about word endings (il/al/el/le) and suffixes (ment, ness, ful and less).

We will be looking at adventure fiction texts and write letters, instructions and stories where we can innovate our own endings!

In maths, Year 1s will learn about multiplication and division as well as fractions. Year 2s will be learn about measurement and fractions.

In geography and history we will explore the journey of the Titanic. During science lessons we will discover more about plants and what they need to survive.

We will use clay to make tiles in art and in DT, we will prepare and taste-test different foods to help us design a healthy wrap.

The children will be learning how to create digital music in computing. In PE we will practice athletics skills.

In PSHE we will explore friendships and in RE we will be recount the Creation story.

Reminders...

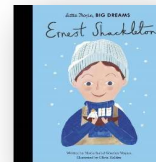
Please make sure your child brings their bag to school every day, with their reading book.
