Key Learning this term...

This term EYFS are travelling all the way to the coldest places on Earth - Antarctica and The Arctic!

We'll be exploring adventure stories and information texts about animals that live in these cold places.

During National 'Anti Bullying' week (week beginning 14th Nov) we will explore stories about acceptance/individuality and engage in activities that will help us learn what bullying is and how to deal with unkind behaviour and bullying.

In maths, we will be exploring numbers up to 10. We will count objects and practise writing and ordering numbers. We will also start to look at number bonds for numbers up to 5.

In literacy, we will continue to encourage children to write their name, using correctly formed letters and holding their writing equipment with a correct grip. We will learn the letter sounds to match single letters (j,v,w,x,y,z) and some diagraphs (zz/qu/sh/th/ng/nk). Hopefully we will be able to blend sounds to read three letter words by Christmas!

The children will explore the world around them as they discover more about familiar celebrations e.g. Bonfire Night and Christmas. We will also explore nature as we learn about the changing seasons.
