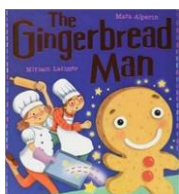
Reception Autumn Term 2022



## Our class texts...



This term, our EYFS children are learning all about traditional tales. We'll be charmed by princes and tricked by wolves and witches!



## Key Learning this term...

We welcome our new starters to class 1. This term EYFS are beginning the year with a topic about Traditional Tales!

We'll be exploring traditional tales and alternative versions. There will be lots of opportunities to listen to and act out stories. If you have any at home that you would be happy for us to read, please send them in with your child.

In maths, we will be exploring numbers up to 5. We will count different objects and practise writing and ordering numbers.

In literacy, we will encourage children to write their name, using correctly formed letters and holding their writing equipment with a correct grip. We have already started to learn about the sound that letters make (phonics) and you will be invited to find out more about how you can help your child with early reading and spelling in a parent workshop that will take place on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> September (more information to follow).

The children will explore the world around them as they discover more about Autumn, the Christian festival of Harvest and Diwali - the Hindu festival of light.
