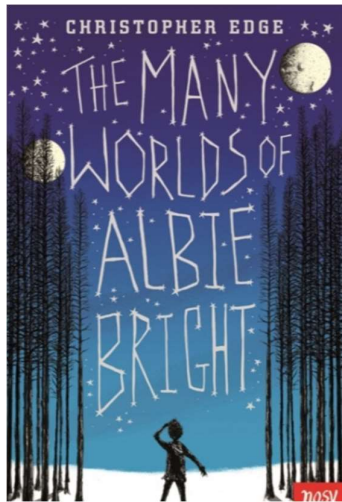

Key Learning this term...

This term in Maths, we will be learning multiplication and division facts. Year 3s will learn facts for 3-, 4-, 6- and 8-times tables. Year 4s will learn all tables up to 12x12. We will be applying our knowledge into problem solving, then multiplying and dividing larger numbers. In English, we will be studying poetry by Pie Corbett and writing our own. We will also be studying the book: 'The Many Worlds of Albie Bright'. We will be using this text to inspire our writing through biographies, reports and descriptive writing.

In Geography, we will be learning about mountains, how they are formed, features and locating mountain ranges around the world. In Science, we will be exploring states of matter and the difference between solids, liquids and gases. In Art/textiles we will be developing our sewing skills and making cushions. In French, we will be learning adjectives. In Music, we will be using glockenspiels and growing our musical knowledge by learning about rhythm, pitch and musical symbols. In RE, we will be learning the Christmas story and how Christians celebrate this festival. In Computing, we will be creating media through stop frame animations.
